Summary	Following extensive engagement with Gloucestershire businesses and our partners in the public sector and supported by an evidence base of nearly 300 submissions, Gloucestershire's Local Industrial Strategy was launched at our Annual Review event on 19 <sup>th</sup> September 2019.  The strategy identifies Gloucestershire's strengths, opportunities and challenges and aligns with the Government's national Industrial Strategy, which focuses on:

	At our Annual Review we announced a period of consultation in order to see feedback from key local stakeholders.  This paper provides an overview of feedback received following extensive consultation and makes recommendations for revisions to the LIS prior to re-submission to Government.
